# TOPIC SERVANT LEADERSHIP

## **EPISODE NOTES**

When we claim the name of Christ Jesus, it is so important that we reflect him in our leadership and everything we do.

### 1. What is Servant Leadership.

Servant Leadership is about being focused on your followers.

Leaders can typically focus on three things – neither one necessarily wrong, just different:

- Yourself transactional leadership
- The organization
- Servant leadership the highest level of leading.
  - o Building them, helping them, working with them.
  - o Seeing them for who they can become.

# 2. What is the definer of Servant Leadership?

Servant leadership has several defining characteristics:

- Love the primary definer.
- Humility
- Altruism
- Trust
- Vision
- Empowerment
- Service

A great question to ask a leader – "Whose feet are you washing?" Who are you serving and how are you serving them? Jesus set this example for us.

Philippians 2:3-4 – "Do nothing out of selfish ambition."

We have to realize it's not about us.

Jesus reduced the entire Old Testament law down to two:

- Love God
- Love others

**1 Corinthians 13:1** – "If I speak in the tongues of men or of angels, but do not have love, I am only a resounding gong or a clanging cymbal.

Leadership should lead with LOVE.

We hear about the concept of servant leadership in the marketplace and in the ministry.

There is a tendency however for Christians to think, "I am Christian; therefore, I am servant."

But this is not always the truth – some Christian leaders are dismal.

We can find dismal leaders in both areas, but the Christian leader has a greater obligation.

Great leaders are not one-dimensional – they focus on both task and people. Leaders need to engage people as *whole* individuals.

Followers care about how you treat them:

- How you speak to them?
- Are you honest?
- Do you keep your word?
- Do you follow through on your commitments?

It's been said, "People don't leave organizations, they leave leaders."

### 3. What are the misconceptions of Servant Leadership?

- I am Christian; therefore, I am servant not true. This involves intentionality and commitment.
- Servant leadership is weak or permissive (laissez-faire) not true.
- Servant leadership is not bold, strong, or in charge not true.
  - o Sometimes love is tough; it says, "No," or "you're fired."

We look forward to the day when we don't have to use the terms "servant leadership," because all leadership should be servant leadership.
